

efficient, water-wise, affordable rental housing development for 150 families whose incomes are at or below 60 percent of the area's median income. These 1-, 2- and 3-bedroom units will help individuals transition from crisis living to a stable community by integrating housing along with on-site education, employment, recreation facilities and social services for individuals and families in need. This project is part of a larger City of Las Vegas 10-year plan to transform a 20-acre former homeless corridor and tent city into a vibrant community with affordable rental housing and social services.

Since 1993, Citi has supported Nevada HAND's efforts to provide quality affordable housing for low-income citizens through community development lending, Citi Foundation grants, contributions and capacity building — including staff development and interns sponsored by Citi's Community Scholar Intern program.

FINANCIAL EDUCATION

In 2004, Citi businesses and the Citi Foundation made an unprecedented, 10-year, \$200 million commitment to support and promote financial education programs around the world. Citi established its Office of Financial Education to lead the effort. Through this initiative, Citi will touch the lives of millions of people by supporting financial education that will help them achieve their dreams. Citi helps individuals, families, and entrepreneurs learn to manage money effectively, use credit wisely, and benefit from financial services to achieve their personal and business goals.

Teaching Financial Stability

The Las Vegas-based **Foundation for an Independent Tomorrow** (FIT) helps unemployed and underemployed Nevadans to get on the path toward financial stability. Citi and FIT have been partners in this effort since 1997 and Citi representatives have served on the organization's board of directors for a number of years. FIT's programs include comprehensive screening, vocational testing, education, training and job placement for low-income people seeking employment, better jobs and sustainable salaries.

Citi is helping to deliver financial education to FIT clients — many of whom have no personal experience with any kind of banking relationship — to help ready them for entry into the workforce. One day each week, Citi volunteers teach a class for approximately 10 individuals, on Access to Credit, Budgeting, Asset Building and Credit Restoration.

The classes are held in FIT's new headquarters facility. With Citi's assistance, FIT acquired a parcel of land donated by the City of Las Vegas, in the city's Enterprise Empowerment Zone. The facility now includes classrooms, a technology lab, a library and individual counseling cubicles in which caseworkers and their clients can meet.
